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UKES FOR SCHOOLS TEACHERS - STEVE KRITZER

UFS: What initially attracted you to the ukulele?

Steve Kritzer: It's bright and "cheerful" sound, and it's versatility for only having four strings. Also the surprising international community of ukulele players. As a teacher, it's ease of playing, especially for seniors, children, and others who may have challenges with the guitar.

UFS: Teaching has been a prominent part of your career, primarily with the guitar. Now, you almost exclusively teach ukulele. Why?

Steve: Due to it's relative ease of playing, it's very gratifying for the students and for me to have them be able to make music in the first lesson. As a jam leader, it's especially fun and rewarding to have an instrument that can bring people together so easily, and give them the experience of playing together with other musicians in a fun and non-threatening way.

UFS: You have recently joined as a board member of Ukes For Schools, a Sacramento-based charitable organization that provides ukuleles for schools and teachers. What influenced your decision to take an active role in Ukes For Schools?

Steve: The opportunity to be able to help kids experience the joy of music who may not otherwise be able to.

UFS: What does the future hold for you and the ukulele?

Kritzer: Introducing more people to being able to make music both individually and with a group, songwriting on the ukulele, and finding new ways to connect with people around the world through the ukulele.
